

## GREENWOOD, RHODES (PURAU) LEASES 1846.

D101: Greenwood & Rhodes. Updated: 3 Here-turi-koka 2008.

**Greenwoods' Maori Lease** (about 25,000ha.) 1&2 October 1846. Kaituna – Opawaho.

‘The Greenwoods run is described as bounded on the North and Northwest by “Pegassus (sic) Bay” and the Opawaho (Heathcote) River, on the West by “Lake Waihora”, on the South by the “flat land” in Kaituna Valley, thence by a straight line to the head of Port Levy, and in the east by the western shore of Port Levy and out to Pegasus Bay. Thus it included all the Port Hills as well as the whole of Ahupatiki (Mount Herbert) divide.’

F275. Whakapapa from Shortland 1851: Table A & B.  
A cousin of Tuhawaiki's parent Kura  
A cousin of Tamaiharanui's parent Te Wakatitiro.
